Improve your clients' movement, pain management, injury prevention, performance, and recovery through Endeavour's HLT52015 Diploma of Remedial Massage. This course enables you to register to become a registered health provider and provides valuable skills toward running your own practice.

As a student you will gain a wealth of theoretical knowledge and practical experience that will put you in good stead when you complete your course. Our diploma course gives you the skills you need to become a qualified remedial massage therapist and opens the door to a wide range of career options – both Australia-wide and globally.

Course Duration

- 1 year full time: 24 contact hours per week (4 x 10 week terms)

Study Mode

Face-to-face on campus with selected subjects available online. See the course structure opposite for online availability.

Delivery Modes defined

Our subjects are delivered in a mix of synchronous (live) and asynchronous (not live) modes of learning. These delivery modes are defined as follows:

- **Online** – fully digital structured learning, supported by our expert academics. Asynchronous (not live) delivery, can study this subject at any time during the week within specified delivery periods. Specific due dates still apply to assessment items.
- **On campus** – attend live classes on one of our 6 campuses at specific timetabled times throughout the week. Supported by online study materials.
- **Livestream** – attend live classes virtually at specific timetabled times throughout the week. Supported by online study materials. International students are required to attend livestream classes on campus in our purpose-built digital classrooms.
- **Blended** – a mixture of live classes (could be scheduled on campus or via livestream) and online content delivery.

Entry Requirements

Endeavour College is a direct entry institution. Students will need to provide one of the following:

- A copy of a Senior Secondary Certificate of Education (i.e. a Year 12 qualification) or
- A copy of a higher level qualification completed or successful completion of 1 year FTE or
- Achieve competency in Exit Level 3 score and working at Level 4 within the Australian Core Skills Framework assessments in Reading and Numeracy
- English language proficiency equivalent to a 6.0 IELTS is required.

Transfer Credit

Students may apply for credit for subjects recently studied in formal education.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

Students may apply for RPL based on relevant work experience and educational history.

Attendance

Attendance will be monitored to ensure international students in a VET course attend over 80% of course contact hours as required by visa conditions.

Payment Options

Tuition payment arrangements must be confirmed upon admission to the College.

Students must pay initial tuition fees deposit upon admission and balance two weeks prior to the relevant intake commencing. Payment of tuition fees for subjects enrolled in future intakes will only be accepted six weeks prior to the relevant intake/s. All payments must be made in Australian Dollars.

Classes

Classes are taught by experts who are highly trained in their fields and who bring their own clinical experience to provide context to foundational and therapeutic studies.

Practical Classes

Students must be physically capable of completing clinical components of the course. To support learning, students attend practical classes where they are expected to practice interviewing and case assessment techniques as well as physical clinical examination and treatment procedures. This is conducted under the supervision of qualified instructors and with respect for privacy, cultural and religious differences.

Teaching Clinics

Students gain clinical experience at Endeavour Wellness Clinics under the supervision of qualified practitioners. Our busy clinics provide the opportunity to develop and hone all skills required to run a successful clinic after

graduation, including client assessment and management, client recruitment and continuity of care, and customer service.

Clinical Hours

Students will spend a minimum of 200 hours in clinic.

Assessments

Undertaking assessments is a part of educational study and provides students with the opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge and skills against the unit of study and the relevant units of competency requirements. Assessments in this course are competency based and may be, but not limited to: assignments, quizzes, exams, practical and clinical demonstrations, tutorial and forum participation. Students enrolled in online units may be required to undertake assessments at the College where required.

Online Learning Requirements

Professional associations vary as to the amount of online learning that they accept in a Diploma. Their standards may change at any time and although Endeavour commits to keeping students informed of such changes, ultimately it is the student's responsibility to keep abreast of these issues to ensure they meet the qualifications.

Career Opportunities

When you become a qualified remedial massage therapist, a range of career opportunities are available to you. These include managing your own business, working within health retreats and spas, providing massage services to elite athletes, working in corporate health and more.

Graduates often choose to practice as sole traders, as a part of a multidisciplinary practice or establish a partnership with other healthcare professionals. Experienced remedial therapists can gain employment as trainers with RTOs around Australia through completing VET Trainer qualifications.
