Delivery Methods and Contextualisation	<p>The competency units will be delivered on campus through participation in clinic practicums at the college's Wellnation Clinic. Students will be required to deliver and evaluate the impact of remedial massage on a range of clients of different ages and genders with varying presentation.</p> <p>The unit of study is highly practical, with learning largely experiential, applying knowledge from previous units in a practical environment representative of a massage clinic.</p>
Delivery / Learning & Assessment Hours	<p>On campus delivery – Full-time and Part-time students</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3 hours face to face per week for 10 weeks via clinic participation • 3.5 hours self-study per week <p>Endeavour may deliver units of study in intensive format for smaller cohorts whilst still ensuring that all requirements as recommended by the Health Training Package are met.</p>

Unit of Study Overview	<p>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to evaluate and enhance own practice through a process of reflection and ongoing professional development. It also describes the skills and knowledge required to monitor and evaluate remedial massage treatments, both from an individual client and whole of practice perspective.</p> <p>This unit applies to workers in the massage sector who take pro-active responsibility for their own professional development.</p> <p>Students will learn the process of monitoring the impact of remedial massage treatment through recognition of changes in client condition. This will include observation skills, treatment assessment and interaction with other relevant personnel (e.g. medical and allied health professionals, parents/carers, the client).</p>
